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
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INTRODUCTION

When people regard a smart person, clad in expensive clothing, driving a nice car or staying in a big house, they assume that the owner of those things must be excellent. However, excellence is much more than the physical appearance of a person or the acquisition of material wealth.

Excellence is the ability to consistently know what to do, when to do it and how to do it. While someone may do this in one area, being excellent affects one's life completely such that when one's life is examined there will be no area lacking but everything about them is lived excellently.

Excellence is a lifestyle.

For many, excellence has been an elusive idea because it has not been properly understood and neither has its origin been understood. Therefore, although it is much desired, many have died without achieving it and others have lived without knowing it.

Fortunately, the word of the Lord clearly explains the origin of excellence and further elaborates to us what actual excellence looks like. It is the word of the Lord that gives a believer the blueprint to use in order to achieve excellence in their daily lives.

My Experience with Excellence

Excellence or being excellent is something a great number of people have encountered but haven't known how to achieve because it is alien to most. Excellence, simply defined, is one's ability to know what to do, how to do it, when to do it, consistently.

Excellence is in the consistency - doing something regularly and with undeterred focus. Most people will only be able to undertake a task once or twice and because they don't have the ability (and discipline) to do it consistently. So, when a person develops the ability to consistently do the same thing irrespective of the time or the season then they can be called excellent.

Over the years, I have been blessed to visit some very nice restaurants but while some were mediocre others were excellent. When one visits both an excellent and a mediocre restaurant, one can immediately tell a difference because the excellent restaurant will consistently serve great food and in good time while a mediocre restaurant will lack consistency in their service and often take longer to deliver. For the latter, one day the food is great then on another day the food is not well done and on the third day, it will be great again! This lack of consistency is what disqualifies many people (and institutions) from a life of excellence.

I was born into a family with a father who was in the military and a mother who was a policewoman. One of the things they excelled in was time-keeping. If my father said he'd be somewhere at seven o'clock, he actually meant six-thirty! He never believed in being late so he was up an hour earlier so as to arrive for his appointments earlier than planned. I remember one particular Sunday when we were running late for church and after reminding us more than twice that we were going to be late, he started the car and drove off, leaving us all behind! Imagine our shock! We were forced to find other means to get to the church which made us even later than we had anticipated! According to my father, it wasn't enough to get to an appointment on time. Instead, one had to get to their desired appointment

earlier than planned. To date, I haven't met another person who keeps time as excellently as my father does. The trick, however, is in knowing what tasks one has and then knowing how to accomplish these tasks earlier so that one can have ample time to consistently meet other targets.

Excellence is not supposed to be only visible in one area but because we are human beings and carry a lot of imperfection, one will normally observe excellence in other people's lives in one or two areas only. However, the mind of God, and His earnest desire, is that man can live excellently in every area of their lives. This is naturally impossible if done in one's strength and that's why God has availed help for every believer. The excerpts from the scriptures below portray the kind of people who were able to live excellent lives with the help God made available. This help is the person of the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Excellence.

THE LIFE OF JESUS CHRIST IS THE PATTERN

The life of Jesus Christ was a life characterised by excellence. Jesus knew what to do, when to do it and how to be consistent. Scripture indicates that there wasn't a time in His ministry where Jesus was stuck or lost or uncertain of how to go forward.

The excellence portrayed in the Life of Jesus Christ was as a result of the ministry of the Holy Spirit. Without the Holy Spirit, Jesus Christ would have lived a life of mediocrity that would have defeated the purpose for which He came into the earth.

However, it's important to note that besides the Holy Spirit being the main contributor to the excellence portrayed in the ministry of Jesus Christ, other factors played an important role in His life. Some of these factors are as follows:

The Word

Even at a tender age, Jesus started to prepare for His ministry by understanding that knowledge of the word was key. As a result of this understanding, Jesus dedicated time to study the word. Although Scripture may not highlight several incidences of Him studying the word, His ministry is proof of how knowledgeable He was concerning the Word.

After being separated from him for three days, they finally found him in the temple, sitting among the Jewish teachers, listening to them and asking questions. All who heard Jesus speak were astounded at his intelligent understanding of all that was being discussed and at his wise answers to their questions. His parents were shocked to find him there, and Mary scolded him, saying, "Son, your father and I have searched for you everywhere! We have been worried sick over not finding you. Why would you do this to us?" Jesus said to them, "Why would you need to search for me? Didn't you know that it was necessary for me to be here in my Father's house, consumed with him?" Luke 2:46-49 (TPT)

It was important for Him to know what He was dealing with before embarking on that Journey. Knowing what one is going to do is a very important element if one wants to walk a life of excellence because, without knowing the 'what' i.e., what lies ahead, an individual is already at a disadvantage.

Knowing the 'what' includes having an understanding of the factors that are required to bring about a certain outcome. For instance, if one wants to bake a cake but doesn't know what a cake is, they will inevitably do a poor job. So, even if they have the ingredients and a recipe but don't know what they are making or what the outcome should look like, they won't be able to successfully accomplish their task.

Therefore, having an understanding and a clear picture of what one wants to do is the primary step in accomplishing any task. Jesus Christ understood this well and so He prepared well. That's why, at the time of His ministry, He was constantly prepared for the tasks at hand. It didn't matter whether He was facing His enemy, the devil, or His critics the Pharisees, the Elders and the Sadducees, He was always prepared for their questions and concerns.

Jesus Christ also understood His purpose on the earth which was very important for His ministry. Hadn't he carried an understanding of His purpose and the trials He was going to go through; He would have been ill-prepared for His ministry. While many people have been advertently prepared for their ministries through going to school and getting the required degrees and certificates, many lack an understanding of their purpose on the earth and because this knowledge is lacking, many fail to fulfil their purpose on earth.

Communion

Communion is defined as the sharing or exchanging of intimate thoughts and feelings, especially on a mental or spiritual level.

Jesus knew what he was supposed to do during his earthly ministry because he studied the scriptures but knowing that what wasn't enough because he wouldn't have been able to know how to apply the 'what' by Himself. For instance, while we were in school, we were given different textbooks and asked to study them. For many, the knowledge in these books has remained unused because although it was acquired, knowing how to apply it has remained a mystery.

One has to know 'how' to apply the information they have received for them to achieve productivity from what they have learnt. Jesus took care of the 'how' by communing with the Father through prayer. On several occasions, Jesus separated himself from the disciples and had moments of prayer throughout the night. It was during these moments of separation that God began to show him the 'how'.

So Jesus said, "I speak to you timeless truth. The Son is not able to do anything from himself or through my own initiative. I only do the works that I see the Father doing, for the Son does the same works as his Father. "because the Father loves his Son so much, he always reveals to me everything that he is about to do. And you will all be amazed when he shows me even greater than what you've seen so far! For just like the father has the power to raise the dead, the Son will raise the dead and give life to whomever he wants. John 5:19-21 (TPT)

This is a perfect example of Jesus knowing what He was supposed to do but He needed God the Father to show him 'how'. In different portions of scripture, we see Jesus resurrect the dead, however, this would have been impossible if He only knew the 'what'. A good way to think of this is to consider doctors who are exposed to different concepts of the human body after studying the anatomy of the human body in theory. However, it's been said that when some of them interface with the human body physically to apply what they have learnt, some of them faint!

In this portion of scripture, Jesus is not ashamed to share with His audience from where he learnt the how of his ministry. He informs His audience that although He knows the 'what', it is incomplete without the 'how'.

Nothing I do is from my own initiative, for as I hear the judgement passed by my Father, I execute judgment. And my judgments will be perfect, because I can do nothing on my own, except to fulfil the desires of my father who sent me. John 5:30 (TPT)

The ministry of Jesus Christ was fully dependent on the direction received from his Father, God. Knowing the 'what' of scripture would have been incomplete without God showing Jesus the 'how' of the knowledge he had received.

The Ministry of the Holy Spirit

The ministry of the Holy Spirit synchronises everything Jesus Christ had learnt in perfecting the timing of everything He did. Timing is key if one wants to live a life of excellence. Imagine you went to a restaurant and ordered breakfast which was eventually served an hour late. Regardless of how delicious the food was, the timing is what matters! If the food is delicious but delivered late, the disappointment of the poor service would disqualify that restaurant from being called an excellent restaurant.

The ministry of Jesus Christ was dependent on the Holy Spirit as He showed Jesus when to perform what miracles. Imagine if Jesus was late to perform certain miracles! He wouldn't have lived a life of excellence but, thankfully, Jesus was always on time!

Jesus had the three different keys that caused excellence to work effectively in His life – He knew what to do, how to do it and when to do it, consistently. One without the other automatically leads to a life of mediocrity.

In John 8:3-7 we read about the woman caught in adultery. This is a great example of perfect timing. Had Jesus received His answer to the Pharisees and Religious Scholars a few minutes late, she would have been killed by the time He answered them and his ministry would have been disqualified! Therefore, He had to have an answer for the Pharisees at the right moment.

But the comforter (counsellor, Helper, intercessor, Advocate, Strengthener, Standby) the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name [in my place, to represent me and act on my behalf], He will teach you all things. And he will cause you to recall (will remind you of, bring to your remembrance) everything I have told you. John 14:26, (AMPC)

One can only imagine the many things Jesus had on His mind. So, to choose this answer could only have been through the ministration of the Holy Spirit. A story is told of a preacher who prayed for a lady who had a complicated health condition; the woman's face was distorted with one side of her face higher than the other side and although she had visited different hospitals, she was

unable to receive her healing. She immediately received her healing after he had prayed for her but the moment she returned to her seat, the condition came back and her face returned to the way it was before. So, she returned to the preacher crying because she couldn't understand why the condition had returned. The moment the preacher saw the change, a certain scripture came to his mind and the moment he declared the scripture out loud the woman received her healing back. After her healing, the preacher testified of the working of the Holy Spirit who reminded him of that scripture because, on his own, he wouldn't have been able to remember it. The scripture was: "what do you imagine about the Lord? He will make an utter end: affliction shall not rise up the second time." Nahum 1:9 (KJV)

The condition never returned to the woman and she has been healthy since that day. Timing in our spiritual walk is key if we want to receive success.

In John 4:6-7, Jesus had to be on time to meet the Samaritan woman. Had he been late or early, he would have missed her and, therefore, his opportunity at ministering to the people of Samaria would have gone. This can be likened to a doctor realising what drug to treat his patient with after the patient has gone with the wrong drug. Everything done at the right time, consistently, is what produces the testimony of excellence.

The Samaritan woman was very key in the ministration to her people and had Jesus met the wrong woman, He would have been ineffective at accomplishing his purpose to the Samaritans.

There are so many people who know what to do and how to do it but they never know when to do it. So, after they have missed an opportunity, they are so disappointed. For instance, I have heard of people who met their destiny-helpers but didn't know they were the people they needed. So instead of maximising such opportunities, they acted wrongly and ended up frustrated at a later stage because they had met these people in spaces they least expected to.

A story is told of a man who was wrongly parked on the street. A pedestrian, instead of advising the gentleman about how to park correctly, decided to abuse

him and shout at him. Unknown to the Pedestrian, this man was one of the people who was scheduled to sit on the panel which was due to interview him for a job, he had been praying for. Later that day when they met in the interview room, the Pedestrian and the man driving the car were in shock to meet again. Can you imagine what happened? Yes, the Pedestrian lost his chance at getting the job he had been praying for.

Fortunately, believers have the Holy Spirit who carries the ability to prepare them for those moments when they meet their destiny-helpers so that the believer can maximise those opportunities.

THE LIFE OF THE APOSTLE PAUL The Word

Paul, according to scripture, is a person who walked in excellence. During Paul's ministry he had several instances where Jesus Christ appeared to him. These interactions were important but it is important to remember that Paul had also been a dedicated student of the word and he had excelled at knowing the word.

Then Paul said, "I am a Jewish man who was born in Tarsus, a city of Turkey. However, I grew up in this city and was properly trained in the Mosaic law and tutored by Rabbi Gamaliel according to our ancestral customs. I've been extremely passionate in my desire to please God, just as all of you today." Acts 22:3 (TPT)

Before Paul could fully understand his purpose, he was fully prepared for it. As the author of three-quarters of the new testament, Paul had to have an understanding of the scriptures before receiving the revelations He received from Jesus Christ through the person of the Holy Spirit. Had Paul been ignorant in the 'what', which were the scriptures, he would have been ineffective in his ministry.

As one studies the writings of Paul to the different churches, it's interesting to see the references made to the Mosaic Law in contrast to the grace of God. Paul, having been chosen before the foundation of time, had to be prepared in the 'what'. That's why he was taught but, furthermore, he practised what was taught. Therefore, when the revelation of grace was given to him, he was able to perfectly portray the same to his readers. Had Paul been poorly equipped in the scriptures and his knowledge of the law, he wouldn't have been able to properly appreciate the meaning of the grace of God in contrast with the law.

By now you have heard of how severely I harassed and persecuted Christians and did my best to systematically destroy God's church, all because of my radical devotion to the Jewish religion. My zeal and passion for the doctrines of Judaism distinguished me among my people, for I was

far more advanced in my religious instruction than others my age. But then God called me by his grace; and in love, he chose me from my birth to be his. God's grace unveiled his Son in me so that I would proclaim Him to the non-Jewish people of the world. Galatians 1:13-16 (TPT)

Having known the 'what', which was knowledge of the Mosaic Law, he used it as a basis to persecute the church. The Jewish leaders, the Pharisees and the High Priests all carried an understanding of the 'what' just as Paul did but because they didn't carry the accurate understanding of the purpose of the 'what', instead they persecuted the Church of the very God they were trying to please.

I've hunted down and killed the followers of this Way. I have seized them and thrown them into prison, both men and women. All of this can be verified by the High Priest and the Supreme Council of Elders. For they even wrote letters to our fellow Jews of Damascus, authorizing me to arrest them and bring them back to Jerusalem as prisoners to be punished. Acts 22:4-5 (TPT)

Therefore, when one carries a wrong understanding of the 'what', it will automatically lead to error in their judgement.

The Ministry of the Holy Spirit in the Life of Paul [Saul]

During those days, Saul, full of angry threats and rage, wanted to murder the disciples of the Lord Jesus. So, he went to ask the high priest and requested a letter of authorization he could take to the Jewish leaders in Damascus, requesting their cooperation in finding and arresting any who were followers of the way. Saul wanted to capture all of the believers he found, both men and women and drag them as prisoners back to Jerusalem. So, he obtained the authorization and left for Damascus. Just outside the city, a brilliant light flashing from heaven suddenly exploded all around him. Falling to the ground, he heard a booming voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" the men accompanying Saul were stunned and speechless, for they hear a heavenly voice but could see no one. Saul replied, "who are you, Lord?" I am Jesus, the Victorious,

the one you are persecuting. Now, get up and go into the city, where you will be told what you are to do." Saul stood to his feet and even though his eyes were open he could see nothing- he was blind. So, the men had to take him by the hand and lead him into Damascus. For three days he didn't eat or drink and couldn't see a thing. Living in Damascus was a believer named Ananias. The Lord spoke to him in a vision, calling his name. "Ananias". Yes, Lord," Ananias answered. The Lord said, "Go at once to the street called Abundance and look for a man from Tarsus named Saul. You will find him at Judah's house. While he was praying, he saw in a supernatural vision a man named Ananias coming to lay hands upon him to restore his sight." "But Lord," Ananias replied, "many have told me about his terrible persecution of those in Jerusalem who are devoted to you. In fact, the high priest has authorized him to seize and imprison all those in Damascus who call on your name." The Lord Yahweh answered him, "Arise and go! I have chosen this man to be my special messenger. He will be brought before kings, before many nations and before the Jewish people to give them the revelation of who I am. And I will show him how much he is destined to suffer because of his passion for me." Ananias left and found the house where Saul was staying. He went inside and laid hands on him, saying, "Saul, my brother, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road, has sent me to pray for you so that you might see again and be filled to overflowing with the Holy Spirit." Acts 9:1-17 (TPT)

This portion of scripture describes Paul's conversion. As previously indicated; Paul was a man taught under the religious system. He had knowledge of the 'what' as taught according to the law of Moses. According to this teaching, it was believed that everything Jesus did was contrary to what the law had taught for so long. So, having this encounter was important for Paul because then he had proof beyond doubt that every-thing he knew was a partial truth and that, the disciples of Jesus Christ, on the other hand, had the actual truth and they were doing the will of the Father.

After this encounter, Paul had not only received correction from his error but also received the infilling of the Holy Spirit. Without the infilling of the Holy Spirit, Paul was going to fail because he needed supernatural strength to do the assignment attached to his life.

This encounter with the Lord launched Paul into his ministry and through the presence of the Holy Spirit, Paul received the revelation of the gospel of Grace. Without the presence of the Holy Spirit, Paul wouldn't have been able to accomplish his assignment on the earth.

Several scriptures indicate that Paul did mighty exploits and persevered through different challenges with supernormal strength.

The ministry of Paul was characterised with Excellence because when he received the 'what' according to the Law, it was further taught to him more excellently through the revelation of Jesus Christ.

Paul's ministry was to reveal to people that the righteousness of God is made available through Jesus Christ and not in fulfilling the Law as the Jews had been taught and had believed for a very long time.

But now independently of the Law, the righteousness of God is tangible and brought to light through Jesus, the Anointed One. This is the righteousness that the Scriptures prophesied would come. It is God's righteousness made visible through the faithfulness of Jesus Christ. And now all the who believe in him receive that gift. Romans 3:21-22 (TPT)

This was the deal-breaker for many of the Jews because this was contrary to what many had believed for so long. That's why Paul needed to have an encounter with Jesus Christ because this was the only way he could believe that everything he had believed wasn't wrong but there was a more excellent way to accomplish what the Law had failed to do which was to give those that kept it righteousness.

Where, then, is there room for boasting? Do our works bring God's acceptance? Not at all! It was not our works of keeping the law but our faith in his finished work that makes us right with God. So, our conclusion is this: God's wonderful declaration that we are righteous in his eyes can

only come when we put our faith in Christ, and not in keeping the law.
Romans 3:27-28 (TPT)

The Holy Spirit carries the ability to change people's minds from a wrong or negative perception to an accurate perception. Paul couldn't have been transformed only by having an encounter because he needed his mind changed and the moment this change took place, Paul's perception and understanding communicated the required changes.

Stop imitating the ideals and opinions of the culture around you, but be inwardly transformed by the Holy Spirit through a total reformation of how you think. This will empower you to discern God's will as you live a beautiful life, satisfying and perfect in his eyes. Romans 12:2 (TPT)

Communion

It is important to note that knowing the 'what' is not enough if one doesn't have communion with God. It is through the process of communing with God that the 'what' is properly understood and as one studies the Journey of Paul the Apostle, it's important to note that until he met the master, the 'what' that he knew all along wasn't all there was to it.

The only thing they heard about me was this: "our former enemy, who once brutally persecuted us, is now preaching the good news of the faith that he was once obsessed with destroying!" Galatians 1:23 (TPT)

After Paul received an accurate understanding of the 'what', this same knowledge that he had obtained in his studies was used as a means to perfect the saints for the work of ministry. It's important to note that throughout Jesus Christ's ministry, he stated that he hadn't come to remove the law but to fulfil it.

After Paul was introduced to the person of Jesus Christ, it was through constant communion that he received the revelation of the new testament grace – meaning that his 'what' was now fully constituted.

Beloved ones, let me say emphatically that the gospel entrusted to me was not given to me by any man. No one taught me this revelation, for

it was given to me directly by the unveiling of Jesus the Anointed One.

Galatians 1:11(TPT)

At this point, Paul had the 'what' and, therefore, he could start to live a life of excellence. Jesus never left him to carry out the 'what' in his own strength but, rather, Paul was further equipped for his journey through the person of Jesus Christ and the presence of the Holy Spirit.

That night our Lord appeared to Paul and stood before him and said, "Receive miracle power. For just as you have spoken for me in Jerusalem, you will also speak for me in Rome." Acts 23:11 (TPT)

For Paul, communion meant not just understanding the 'what' but also the 'how' and through these appearances, Paul was able to receive insights into the workings of God.

Paul's life depicts the actual journey of a person before they meet Jesus Christ at the point of salvation. Many have been raised under different religious sects and, therefore, believe a certain way until they meet Jesus Christ. The moment one accepts Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour just as Paul did, they embark on the beautiful journey of salvation.

Without the ministry of the Holy Spirit, even though many are born-again, they are unable to live out their lives of salvation wholly because it is the Holy Spirit who changes one's mind and causes them to accurately understand the word of God.

Finally, through Communion, these changes keep happening. The changes portrayed in Paul's life were not accomplished in one day but over a period of time, and it is important to note that these changes were governed by these three principles: accurate knowledge of the word, communion with the Holy Spirit and consistency. According to the letters of Paul, there is never a point where he stated that he didn't need to commune through prayer or where he stated that when one accomplishes certain tasks or assignments then they have reached the end of their journey. On the contrary, Paul acknowledged his constant need for communing with the Lord.

It's important to note that Paul and the Christians of his time did not have the bible as we do and that's why he had to write letters to the different churches. In these letters, he laid out guiding instructions on how they were supposed to live. Fortunately for believers, the Bible is a compilation of everything a bornagain believer needs to live a life a victory but if this bible is not accurately divided under the guidance of the Holy Spirit through consistent communion then one is deprived of achieving their God-given purpose with excellence.

Always be eager to present yourself before God as a perfect and mature minister, without shame, as one who correctly explains the Word of Truth. 2 Timothy 2:15 (TPT)

Salvation

If you want to receive and enjoy excellence through the ministry of the Holy Spirit, it all starts when one accepts Jesus Christ because one must be bornagain.

Because if you acknowledge and confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and, in your heart, believe (adhere to, trust in, and rely on the truth) that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart a person believes (adheres to, trusts in, and relies on Christ) and so is justified (declared righteous, acceptable to God), and with the mouth he confesses (declares openly and speaks out freely his faith) and confirms [his] salvation. Romans 10:9-10 (AMPC)

This confession can be done through the following prayer:

Dear Lord Jesus, today I acknowledge that You gave your life to redeem me from my sin. I believe with my heart that You were raised by God from the dead and I receive Your gift of salvation right now by faith. Thank You for revealing Your love and grace to me. In the mighty name of Jesus Christ, Amen.

After saying this prayer, you are now born-again. However, to enjoy this journey more, Jesus promised us the gift of the Holy Spirit. He said that when the Spirit came, He will guide us into all things. Therefore, by faith through prayer, we

receive the gift of the Holy Spirit to guide us on this new journey we have started.

Father, I thank You for the gift of the Holy Spirit. I thank You that You desire that I live a victorious Christian life. So today I receive the Holy Spirit in my life by faith, to the glory of Your name. In the mighty name of Jesus Christ, Amen.

Having said these prayers by faith, you have embarked on a personal journey with God. It is important for you to join a bible-believing and bible-teaching church so that you can learn more about God and His love for you.
